Review

◆ A high point in the story

◆ A letter to "all peoples, nations, languages" (v 1)

◆ Has worldwide implications

1. A Great King Humbled

- ◆ Given dreams to reveal unfolding of history
- ◆ He is at peace, living in luxury
- ◆ Receives this dream as a warning
 - Daniel advises he changes his ways
 - ♦ For a further year he lives in pride & sin
 - He is driven into a form of madness
 - Becomes a deranged animal living in the wild

1. A Great King Humbled . . .

- Writes a letter describing what happened
- ◆ He possibly became a follower of God
- Reveals there is a God who oversees human affairs

2. A Greater God Acts

- ◆ God's revelation to Nebuchadnezzar begins with a dream
 - ♦ Made him aware of the powerful God of the Jews
 - A God involved in the affairs of the world
- ◆ His worldly empire was oppressive
 - ♦ God acted against him
 - His luxury was on the backs of oppressed people

2. A Greater God Acts . . .

- ♦ Nebuchadnezzar does not listen
 - ♦ He will be humbled
- ◆ Eventually he looks to God (v 34)
 - God restores him to his throne (v 36)
 - ♦ Now he knows who is in charge (v 37)

3. A Testimony to the World

- ◆ Letter testifies Most High God has absolute authority
 - God rules the earth and will give authority to whom he wants
 - ♦ Testifies to the greatness of God in 2 short psalms (v 3, 35)

LIVING IT —

- ◆ Take in broad sweep of history
 - ♦ People of Judah in exile
 - Kingdom of Israel went to captivity in Assyria
 - ♦ Reason: Refusal to worship YHWH alone
- ◆ Jews return with one indelible lesson:
 - There is only one god who should be worshipped
 - ♦ Faced brutal persecution for refusing to acknowledge other gods

- LIVING IT -

- ◆ Stance of early Christians built on this conviction
- Lasting implications right up to the present day
 - Most people assume there is only one God (or no god)
 - ♦ Everything is under God's control

LIVING IT —

- ◆ This knowledge was essential for Jesus' ministry
 - ♦ Theology of TRINITY one God in three persons
 - How the apostles knew God was not just God of the Jews
 - ♦ If there is only one God, he is God of everyone
- ♦ Westminster Shorter Catechism:
 - Man's chief end is to glorify God and enjoy him forever.
